Welcome to yet another edition of 'Possum Droppings' from the National Administrative Body (NAB) of the 161 Recce Association.

We hope this newsletter finds you all enjoying good health and that the coming Christmas period brings you peace and happiness.

The main purpose of this newsletter is to provide you with a brief summary of the recent 'Gathering of Possums' in Townsville to celebrate the 45th Anniversary (Possum 45 – P45) of the raising of 161 Recce Flt in June 1965 and the subsequent deployment of the Flight to South Vietnam on 14 September 1965.

The elected members of the NAB are John Custance (President), Skeeta Ryan (Secretary/Treasurer) and Len Avery (Assistant).

Sadly, during the past 12 months we have lost a further three of our 161 members. As the Executive of the 161 Recce Assoc and on behalf of all of the members of the 161 Recce Assoc we would like to extend our condolences to the family and friends of the following members;

A1647 Flight Sergeant Keith Archibald (Bones) Einam – RAAF.

Keith served with 161 (Indep) Recce Flight from 28 March 1968 until 23 October 1968 as the Senior NCO In Charge of Maintenance.

Keith was born on the 13th July 1928 and passed away on the 4th July 2010.

39017 Corporal Michael Hugh (Mick) Lappin CSM – RAEME.

Mick served with 161 (Indep) Recce Flt from 24 March 1969 until 04 March 1970 as a Corporal Radio Mechanic.

Mick was born on the 17th November 1947 and passed away on the 22nd September 2010.

17631 Lance Corporal Errol Ross (Blue) Potter – RAASC.

Errol served with 161 (Indep) Recce Flt from 25 May 1966 until 10 May 1967. Errol worked in the 161 Command Post as a Radio Operator as well as at 'Nui Dat Arty – Kanga Control' as a radio Operator.

Errol was born on the 22nd November 1945 and passed away on the 5th April 2010.

*** We have also received news that at least another one of our members passed away a number of years ago however, we have yet to confirm the date and details of that members' passing.*

Those members who have recently passed away will be dearly missed by their immediate family members and those who had the honour of serving with them as members of 161.

Presidents Report.

The tone of the evening was evident when our MC could not shut up the natives so that welcomes could be passed.

Thursday will never be forgotten. The day started with a Memorial Service attended by a large gathering of Possums, their partners and a great rollup of serving members from the 5th Aviation Regiment. The current "Possum Master", Major Dan Bartle addressed the gathering while wreaths were laid by the Commanding Officer of the Regiment, Lieutenant Colonel James Brown and I representing our Association. 5 Avn Regt also provided a guard of honour who did an excellent job. The bugler for the day was Bill Norton and a young Craftsman 'James Sagar' dressed in a kilt played the pipes.

Thank you to both LTCOL Brown, the RSM WO1 Wayne Harper (and their merry band of men), who produced a magnificent spread and made us very, very welcome. One knows the food was great when there was seafood left over. Thank you to all members of 5 Avn Regt. Following our feast we were privileged to be given free access to static displays of the Regiment aircraft on the tarmac as well as access to the main maintenance hangar. Thank you boys and girls from the Workshop.

One to go, and as expected Friday night at the RSL was outstanding! The boys in Townsville were in panic mode when the attendance figure reached 295 which was the maximum capacity for the room; however, everything went without a hitch. I must commend the powers of our AAAvn Honorary Colonel Major General Jim Molan. Matters pertaining to the loans or donation of historical importance to the MAAF were discussed during the meeting and are to be investigated by the National Executive Committee.

I singled out Major Dan Bartle and on behalf of our Association congratulated him on being awarded the Aviator of the Year for outstanding Contributions to Combat Aviation.

We will be approaching the Australian War Memorial to have a plaque placed in the Memorial in honour those of 161 who made the supreme sacrifice and others who have passed during or following their service in Vietnam.

Len has mentioned the 161 Assistance fund. It received great response at the General Meeting and has since has been utilised very positively.

To our members, their partners and guests who attended Possum 45, THANK YOU for making it the great gatherings of Possums that it was.

It is the festive season, therefore, let me take this opportunity to wish all of you a very happy Xmas and a bright and healthier New Year.

Treasurer/Secretary (Waffling) Report

Sandra and I attended Possum 45 and we had a wonderful time catching up with 'old' friends and meeting those who had not attended a 'Possum Gathering' before.

It was particularly pleasing to catch up with Dan Bartle and Darren McCormick, the current Possum Master and SSM of 161 Recce Sqn respectively. The Squadron is in good hands and the future looks bright and exciting for those who are in the Squadron.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank those members of the North Queensland Branch for the excellent job they did in organising P45.

As the secretary/treasurer of the 161 National Executive it was my task to present a summary of the correspondence which has passed through the National Branch in recent times and the financial status of the National Branch.

I am ably assisted and totally supported in carrying out my duties by Len Avery who maintains all of our 161 records including those of the National Branch.

The financial income into the National Branch Account comes from limited resources which includes membership, sales through the 161 PX and donations from our members.

With the recent establishment of the 161 Recce Assoc Assistance Fund we have three accounts within the 161 National Branch. The National Access Account, for our day to day operations, the Cash Management Account, which holds the seeding fund for future 'Possum Gatherings' and the recently established Assistance Fund Account, which is used to provide immediate short term assistance to those members who may need some form of assistance. For those who may be unaware all our National Accounts are with DEFCREDIT.

All income and expenditure through the 161 National Branch is receipted and recorded whilst all expenditure is paid for by cheque which requires at least two of the three authorised signatories of those designated to sign the cheques.

Len Avery maintains detailed records for all income to and expenditure from the 161 National Accounts. On a regular and ongoing basis I cross-check and verify the records. All financial statements are compiled and maintained by Len and myself and are available for viewing, on request of any or all Members of the 161 Recce Assoc.

At the General Meeting at P45 on the Thursday the 9th September all in attendance were asked to record their presence at the meeting by entry and signatory on the Attendance List. I presented copies of and gave a brief summary of the financial status of the 161 National Branch.

I highlighted the fact that the 161 National Branch had provided the P45 organisers with a cheque for \$2500 from the 161 Seeding Fund (Cash Management Account) to kick start P45. In addition to the funds provided from the Seeding Fund there was a grant from the Department of Veterans' Affairs, a donation from Sikorsky and a loan from the 161 Sydney Branch to allow the P45 organisers to plan and execute an outstanding "Gathering of Possums".

Following on from the conclusion of P45, the organising committee have not only repaid the \$2500 into the 161 Seeding Fund and the loan from the Sydney Branch, they have also made a donation to the 161 Assistance Fund plus a donation into the 161 Reccelections Fund, which is used by Len Avery to continue his work in preserving and maintaining our 161 history and memorabilia.

Hopefully we will get the opportunity to catch up with many of you again at Possum 50 in Darwin if not sooner. Please take care of those you love and may peace be with you.

Possum 45 Gathering Townsville 8-10 Sep 2010

We of the North Queensland Branch would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone who attended P45 from the bottom of our hearts.

You have made our effort of organising the 'Gathering of Possums' (old and young) a great success.

The reunion has come and gone but the memories are still here. It was a culmination of 18 months work done by the main organisers, Russell (Shifty), Alan Meiklejohn and Bruno Kwas ably assisted by others from our Branch as required, and Len Avery as our main postmaster.

A special mention must be made of 5 Avn Regt in their help. LTCOL James Brown welcomed us and offered the base for the Memorial Day with the RSM, WO1 Wayne Harper, as our main contact and get together man inside the fence. Entry to the RAAF Base was a slight problem with Serco so the RSM's phone number went into our mobile phones to make sure we could get entry. LTCOL Chris Bell and his RAEME workers assisted us as well. I don't know why he kept telling the RSM to make sure our hands were in our pockets whenever we visited his part of the base. I think it was his electrical background as a 20th intake Army Apprentice.

We must also make mention of the seeding fund which was given to us from the National Executive, the grant from DVA, the donation from Sikorsky and the loan from the Sydney Branch which allowed us to organise and plan the 'gathering' without worrying about whether we had sufficient funds to cover the costs involved. The seeding fund has been repaid into the National Account as has the loan from the Sydney Branch. A donation has been made to the 161 Assistance Fund as well as the 161 Recollections Account so that Len Avery can continue the work of preserving and maintaining our 161 history and memorabilia.

We kept the committee small to make things easier to manage. Thank you to the South Australian Branch for their contribution. They sent over a copy of their documentation for use in setting up the program. Later we obtained the software for the Possum Logo from them to enable us to produce the NQ design. We in turn will make everything available to the next gathering crew to help them along.

It was a great learning exercise for my computer skills during the time. I found out how to do many things on programs that have sat idle within the black box on the floor. The designs for the placemats, labels etc were produced, reviewed, discarded and redesigned many times over the period before we settled on what you saw on the night. The more astute noted the little extras incorporated within the paperwork but Alan topped the pool with the shirt design with my home being included in the print.

The main thing we learnt from the exercise was to get final numbers for functions well before the date. I had a few sleepless nights trying to sort out dinner figures or if we could get alternative arrangements at the same costs. The trouble with Townsville is the next level up for numbers costs the world and that is why we capped the dinner to 295. The RSL could only cater for that many in a sit down environment so juggling cancellations and others wanting to come at the last moment created a few small problems. Our feedback from the RSL was positive. We were the biggest sit down function they catered for since the renovations and no problems were encountered on the Wednesday and Friday nights.

My biggest regret is not being able to talk to everyone during the three days but I tried. The photos are now on disc but we couldn't name a few people but our editor in chief (Bird) is on the job tracking them down.

Since the reunion we have had a few ARH Tigers come across from Darwin for the major exercise being held now. It was spine tingling to see all our helicopter types in the air over Townsville. It was a pity they couldn't get here earlier.

Once again the Possums of Townsville thank you for coming to our part of Australia and enjoying our great weather and scenery.

161 Recce Sqn News.

Current key appointments in the 161 Recce Sqn are;

Officer Commanding – Major Daniel Bartle, "Possum Master", and
SSM – WO2 Darren McCormick.

Now that 161 Recce Sqn is collocated with the 1st Aviation Regiment, in purpose built facilities at Robertson Barracks in Darwin, along with 162 Recce Sqn from Townsville there have been a number of major changes within the Regiment in regards to how the maintenance support is provided to each of the Squadrons. There is no direct support within the squadrons any more. As previously advised the maintenance support element for each squadron is now centralised within the 1st Aviation Regiment Technical Support Squadron. Direct maintenance support is provided to the squadrons by a Forward Repair Team (FRT) or Forward Repair Group (FRG) as required.

We have included a 161 Sqn Page on our 161 Web Site specifically for the Squadron and we invite former and current members of the Squadron to visit the web site and assist with the expansion of the Squadron History and Photo Gallery.

A message from our current Possum Master.

It was fantastic to be able to attend the P45 celebrations in Townsville; it was really great to see the camaraderie that still exists between all the members and their families. It is something for us to aspire to. My SSM and I thoroughly enjoyed ourselves and learnt a little more about the characters that helped build our aviation history.

The Squadron is just returning from Townsville after Exercise HAMEL, which saw us exercising in support of 3 Brigade in High Range training for these last five weeks or so. It was a good chance to practice our conventional war fighting skills against a thinking enemy played by the NZ Army and Air Force and proved that we are well on the way to our operational capability milestones. We conducted many air mobile operations with the Blackhawks and Chinooks of 5 Aviation Regiment including a live fire air mobile insertion of troops observed by the Chief of Army.

The Squadron flew over 300 hours of reconnaissance and attack missions in the five weeks we were in Townsville with the RAEME boys working around the clock to keep the aircraft on the go while the aircrew located and destroyed the enemy. The exercise culminated in a Brigade live fire practice involving Infantry, Armour, Artillery and for the first time ARH in direct support. It was a great way to finish the year.

We are now tidying up the paperwork and winding down for Christmas and New Year with the Squadron taking a well deserved break. Next year will see a period of change when my replacement Major Kim Gilfillan marches in and the Squadrons within the Regiment shuffle personnel around. I will miss the Squadron life dearly as I head south to Canberra but I hope to be back with the Regiment in a few years time.
